This powerful and evocative setting perfectly encapsulates the impressionistic, fantastical essence of Federico Garcia Lorca's writing.

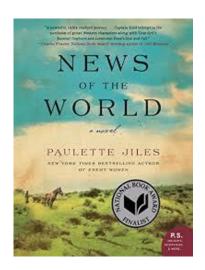
As a composer, conductor, and singer, <u>Bob Chilcott</u> has enjoyed a lifelong association with choral music, first as a chorister and choral scholar in the choir of King's College, Cambridge, and for 12 years as a member of the King's Singers. He became a full-time composer in 1997, and has produced a large catalogue of music for all types of choirs which is published by Oxford University Press. Bob has conducted choirs in more than 30 countries worldwide and has worked with many thousands of amateur singers across the UK in a continuing series of Singing Days. For seven years he was conductor of the Chorus of The Royal College of Music in London and since 2002 he has been Principal Guest Conductor of the BBC Singers.

Coming together to make music is a profoundly unique human experience. In this <u>video</u>, Bob Chilcott talks about the art of learning music, as well as how music brings us together and crosses boundaries that otherwise might never be crossed.
